

## **#NextGenLeaders Programme Stages**



#### PROGRAMME ESTABLISHMENT IN EACH SCHOOL OR COLLEGE

Each team typically has around 6 -12 students and can be from any single or mixed year group. There can be more than one team per institution. Our staff will support school and college staff members in establishing the













#### students on good team skills. PROJECT RESEARCH AND IDEATION

Teams generate project ideas, ideas they are passionate about and want to have impact on in their local community. This phase involves developing different ideas through sessions and workshops, teams research the issue within their local area to make sure their project has maximum impact, along with researching project partners. Resources such as the 'issue cards', can help with this, these are found in the staff manual.



#### PROJECT DEVELOPMENT AND DELIVERY

Students implement their projects and constantly look to review and develop their ideas based on feedback they receive to make sure that it has long term impact. Teams run their project with the chosen project partner to make sure they have meaningful impact on the lives of others.



#### **REGIONAL CELEBRATION EVENT**

At the end of the programme in March, teams showcase their project and the impact they have had with other teams, our corporate partners and project partners. The event is all about celebrating the amazing work teams have delivered and also a chance to reflect on the changes that have been made in their community.

## **Examples of #NextGenLeaders Project Impact**



At South Nottinghamshire Academy, Team SNAid worked with the homeless and a homeless charity to make sure they had supplies for extra food and treats over the Winter period. In the hampers there were personal care items such as hygiene products as well to ensure they felt better within themselves.



At Swanwick Hall School, Team Synergy have been running sessions with two elderly care homes to help with social isolation. They have been running sessions involving games, music and dance after conducting research into what the elderly residents wanted. They have had great feedback from the staff members, "the residents clearly loved the interaction with the young people. The residents have told me they loved the company and activities", staff member at the care home.



At De Lisle College, Team SollutionPollution have been tackling single use plastic in their community and school. They have been running assemblies with their local primary schools to educate younger people on the impact of single use plastic and encourage recycling. They have also been working to reduce single use plastic in their school and find better alternatives.

## Young Leader Development

"By working with students from different year groups, it has helped us progress with our project. It is also good that we know when we move up years the project will continue because of the same students being in the team." Year 10 student.

"Next Gen Leaders has allowed me to develop new skills and improve the skills that I already have. It has given me more confidence and helped me to approach new people with more courage and determination. It is something I have thoroughly enjoyed doing." Year 12 student.

"With Next Gen Leaders, we have learnt many entrepreneurial skills. We have been tasked to discover new problems, discover potential opportunities and work on our strategic thinking." Year 9 student.
